It is out of love and care for each individual that comes to the Lord's Supper that we ask that those who hold a different belief or church membership than that of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, are not instructed and confirmed in the faith, or doubt the presence of Christ and His power in the Sacrament to refrain from attending the Lord's Supper. Please respect our position of love in this matter of pastoral care and speak with a pastor with any questions regarding the Lord's Supper.

# Christ the King Sunday Hymn Festival Based on our Stained Glass Windows

**As We Gather...** Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of Christ (Romans 10:17). When we gather for the Divine Service, our primary purpose is to hear the Word of God and to receive the gifts that God freely gives through His Word. But the Divine Service not only engages our ears but also our eyes. God has attached His spoken Word to visible elements in Baptism and the Lord's Supper bestowing tremendous gifts and blessings through His holy Sacraments.

Our eyes are also engaged when we gather for worship through our stained glass windows. Our windows make the Word visible as they recount God's great salvation from Christ's birth to His glorious return on the Last Day. Our windows are a visible reminder of the journey we take every year as we observe the church year, beginning with the Advent and Christmas seasons and culminating today with Christ the King Sunday when we celebrate the triumphant return of Jesus in glory on the Last Day.

In the Divine Service, we hear the Word. We see the Word. And we sing the Word. Through liturgy and hymnody, we say back to God what He has first said to us. God gives us His good gifts through His Word and Sacraments, and we offer our hymns of thanks and praise. Through His Word, God reveals who He is and what He has done for us, and we confess His saving name through song.

Since our stained glass windows correspond to the church year, it is fitting on this Last Sunday in the Church Year that we use our windows as the means to encounter God's Word today. The Scripture readings are based on the Scriptures contained in each window, with the words in bold reflecting the Scripture included on the window. The Scriptures on all the windows are from one of St. Paul's Epistles reflecting the name of our congregation.

May God richly bless you through Word and song this day as we hear, see, and sing of our God and His glorious salvation!

## Word and Sacraments Stained Glass Windows

On either side of the altar are two stained glass windows. These windows are larger than the stained glass windows on either side of the nave. They are also more translucent to allow for natural light to fill the chancel area.

The window behind the pulpit confesses the Word of God. The Scripture is "Let the Word of Christ dwell in you" from Colossians 3:17. The top symbol is a reminder that God's Word is the Sword of the Spirit. In the middle of the window, you encounter the lamp since God's Word is a lamp for our feet and a light for our path (Psalm 119:105). The harp at the bottom represents the sung word.

The window behind the font confesses the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper. The Scripture is from Ephesians 4:5: "One Lord, one faith, one baptism." The top symbol is the shell and three drops, a symbol of baptism. The three drops represent the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, into whose name we are baptized. The dove represents the Holy Spirit, who descended upon Jesus at His baptism. The Holy Spirit works through the means of grace to forgive our sins and strengthen our faith. The bottom symbol is the bread and cup, a visual reminder of the gift of Christ's body and blood in the Lord's Supper.




## **Cross Stained Glass Windows**

The four pie-shaped stained glass windows around the cross make two symbols, depending on whether you are looking at the windows from the sanctuary or from the outside.

As you look at the chancel wall, the windows make a circle around the center of the cross, representing that Christ is eternal. A circle is a symbol for eternity, because like eternity, a circle does not have a beginning or end.

When looking at these windows from the outside, this same circle represents the world. When the cross is placed above the circle, the circle represents the globe and is a reminder that Christ and the Gospel are for all nations and people, that we are called to "Lift high the cross, the love of Christ proclaim Till all the world adore His sacred name" (LSB Hymn 837).



## Holy Trinity Stained Glass Window

Opposite the chancel cross, as you exit the sanctuary, is the Holy Trinity Stained Glass Window. The circles represent eternity. The three interlocking circles represent the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The three interlocking circles are also connected by one circle representing the mystery of the Trinity. The window is a visual reminder that we worship one eternal God and yet three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

**LIVING THE MESSAGE...** On this Christ the King Sunday, rejoice in Christ's saving work for you from His birth in Bethlehem to His glorious return on the Last Day. As we begin advent next Sunday, consider those you can invite to hear the message of God's salvation in Christ Jesus during this sacred season.

**PRAYERS FOR THE CHURCH...** Give thanks to God for the gift of His Word and for the gift of music by which we are taught the faith and given the opportunity to worship and praise our Lord. Pray for our congregation that we would faithfully gather to receive God's Word and pray that we would always lift high the cross of Christ.
