Building Materials

Dear Church Family,

We are on the cusp of an exciting season in our life together. After our Groundbreaking Service on Reformation Sunday, October 26th, we will watch as the Christian Education Center begins to take shape. I hope you will attend the

Groundbreaking Service at 9:30 AM on the 26th and all the special services and events that are planned for this joyous and historic day.

Whatever you intend to build, you want the building to endure. This includes a solid foundation so that the structure won't sink or shift. But a good building isn't just determined by its foundation. High quality building



materials are needed so that walls do not bow or crack. Insulation is needed so that the structure is energy efficient.

The Scriptures use this same metaphor when describing the Church, not a church building, but the Church, the people of God gathered around His Word and holy sacraments. First, the foundation must be Jesus Christ. He is the solid rock in this world of shifting sand. He is the cornerstone on whom we build our faith and life.

The foundation matters. "The Chruch's One Foundation is Jesus Christ, her Lord" as the hymn reminds us (644:1). However, the building materials also matter. Consider the words of the apostle Paul in 1 Corinthians 3:

According to the grace of God given to me,

like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building upon it.

For no one can lay a foundation other than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ.

Now if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw—
each one's work will become manifest, for the Day will disclose it,

because it will be revealed by fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done.

1 Corinthians 3:10-13

In the coming months, after the foundation is laid and the concrete building pad poured, the structural steel beams will be set in place. Even more important than using quality building materials are the "building materials" that we utilize to build up our church. Here at St. Paul, we are blessed with a strong and sturdy foundation—177 years of faithfully proclaiming the Word of God and reaching out with the saving Gospel of Christ. But the question always before us must be: How are we going to build on the foundation of Jesus Christ? What building materials are we going to use? Are we going to use the best and highest quality—gold, silver, and precious stones—the pure and powerful Gospel of Jesus Christ? Or are we going to try to build upon this solid foundation using hay and straw—gimmicks and human ideas and opinions?

As we celebrate groundbreaking and then witness the Christian Education Center begin to take shape, may it be a reminder for us that our highest priority must be utilizing the highest quality "building materials" in our church and our faith lives. The Lord Jesus and His saving Gospel of Christ crucified and risen for us and for our salvation must be the foundation. God's Word alone is the highest quality building material that will endure every fiery trial that we will experience in this fallen world.

Remain firmly founded on Christ the solid rock. Seek to build your faith and life using the best building material of all—the Word of God. Join with your brothers and sisters in the Divine Service and Bible study so that the Holy Spirit can continue to build us up and make our faith rock solid as the Spirit works through the Word. Tell others about Jesus and invite them to church so that they also can be firmly founded on Christ and with us be built up and fortified in the one true faith. As construction begins on the Christian Education Center, pray that this facility always lives up to its name—truly a center of *Christ*ian education, that Christ and His Word would be the center and focus of all that is said and done for generations to come.

The words of this children's song really sums up our daily prayer life, for it is both good and right to give thanks to the Lord for all He has given us! The simplicity and repetitive nature of this song make it easy to teach and learn, and the truth contained in the text lives in us throughout our lives. We hear expressions like, "stop and smell the roses" that remind us to pause the perpetual activity in our daily life long enough to enjoy the many blessings God has given us. I enjoy the season of fall due to the cooler weather and brilliantly colored leaves, even though the trees are reminding us that winter is coming. We can rejoice in the moment while still keeping the big picture in focus. The church calendar reminds us that we are moving through Reformation and All Saint's to the end of the church year, only to immediately begin the new church year during the season of Advent.

One of the challenges in planning church music is that we are always working on what is coming up and preparing for the next festival or season. Sometimes we need to be reminded to "stop and smell the roses" each Sunday—to rejoice in the proclamation of God's Word through the church's song in that specific time and place. The musical heritage of the Lutheran Church is amazingly rich, varied, and not static, for the Gospel continues to be proclaimed in new music that builds on the tradition of serving the Word through song. One of the gifts I am especially thankful for is the ability to work in this congregation that actively participates in, understands, and supports church music that finds its' sole purpose in supporting the Word of God. All glory be to God alone!

I give thanks to the Lord for Pastor Bauman, Pastor Fickenscher, Pastor Patterson, the ECM and church staff, our youth and adult vocal and bell choirs, instrumental and vocal soloists, and the congregation of St. Paul Lutheran Church. My sincerest thanks for your time, efforts, and dedication in both supporting me and our on-going mission to proclaim the Gospel in word and song!



Christian Education

Re-Reading Scripture

The explanation to the third commandment states that we have the opportunity to hold God's Word "sacred and gladly hear and learn from it". Similar to an exercise regimen or intentionally consuming healthy meals, our spiritual discipline of reading the Bible needs to be scheduled and prioritized. From this practice, we will be fed with the Bread of Life and strengthened in our faith.

Beyond the length differences between the Old and New Testaments, many find the New Testament easier to read because the majority of the recorded information is in the form of historical accounts and written letters. As many of these Biblical stories are taught when we are younger, it is tempting to skim over the accounts when we are reading them. I urge you to dig deep and take the time to fully read these passages. Ever changing life experiences tend to give us new perspectives on familiar Bible readings. We can also be confident that the gift of God's Word does exactly what God promises, "For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall My word be that goes out from My mouth; it shall not return to Me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:10-11).

They immediately give that \$5,000 back to the church as their general fund tithe for 2026. The result is that a \$10,000 gift turned into \$15,000 for St. Paul in a matter of a few short months!

Mark your calendar for the evening of Saturday, December 20th as we will host the annual Christmas celebration of Las Posadas. Don't miss out!




