## Epistle Reading

Romans 4:13-25

[Paul writes:] The promise to Abraham and his offspring that he would be heir of the world did not come through the law but through the righteousness of faith. For if it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law there is no transgression.

That is why it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his offspring—not only to the adherent of the law but also to the one who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all, as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations"—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. In hope he believed against hope, that he should become the father of many nations, as he had been told, "So shall your offspring

be.” He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was as good as dead (since he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah’s womb. No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, fully convinced that God was able to do what He had promised. That is why his faith was “counted to him as righteousness.” But the words “it was counted to him” were not written for his sake alone, but for ours also. It will be counted to us who believe in Him who raised from the dead Jesus our Lord, who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification.

# The Desire of God's Heart—Hosea 6:15-6:6

The Lord calls Hosea to be His prophet and for his m\_\_\_\_\_ to be an object lesson for the Israelites.

How had the Israelites shown themselves to be an unfaithful bride? How had they committed spiritual adultery?

The desire of God's heart for His bride: I\_\_\_\_\_, f\_\_\_\_\_, s\_\_\_\_\_, provide, and protect.

How was Matthew committing spiritual adultery? What was his first love? How is the desire of our Lord's heart revealed in Jesus' call to Matthew?

How is the desire of our Lord's heart revealed to you and to His bride, the Church (all believers)?

Hosea must pay to rescue his wife Gomer from her adulterous (and most likely abusive) relationship. What price did Jesus pay to rescue you to make you His bride?

Through Hosea, we learn the desire of God's heart toward us, His bride. In response, the desire of our hearts to God should be:

R\_\_\_\_\_: Acknowledging our sin and unfaithfulness so He can forgive and restore us.

Steadfast I\_\_\_\_\_ for the LORD more than anyone or anything.

K\_\_\_\_\_ of God, the desire to learn more of Him who is forever committed to us.

Jesus loves sinners. Jesus forgives sinners. Jesus feasts with sinners. When does Jesus feast with you? How is this feast a foretaste of the eternal marriage feast of our Lord with His bride the Church?

**LIVING THE SERMON...** You are loved with an everlasting love despite your sin and infidelity. Return to your Lord in repentance. Rejoice in your Lord's forgiveness and His eternal care, provision, and protection for you. Seek the Spirit's help to desire to love and trust in the Lord above all and to learn more of Him. Feast often with Jesus at His Supper and look forward to the day when Christ will come for His bride, the Church, and we will enjoy the marriage feast in His kingdom that will never end.

**PRAYERS FOR THE CHURCH...** *Jesus Sinners Will Receive*, our hymn of the day, #609, is a prayer of repentance that rejoices in our Lord's love and faithfulness. Pray this hymn often as a confession of sins *and* a confession of faith.
