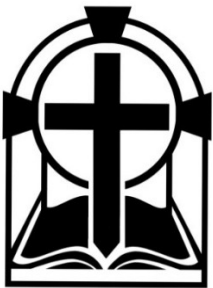

## Epistle Reading

Romans 3:19–28

[Paul writes:] Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. For by works of the law no human being will be justified in His sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God’s righteousness, because in His divine forbearance He had passed over former sins. It was to show His righteousness at the present time, so that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

# A Messenger with a Good Message to Good Message

## Revelation 14:6-7

How is the Gospel of Jesus Christ not only the *good* message, but the *best* message of all?

The Gospel not only informs us about Jesus, the Gospel g \_\_\_\_\_ the gifts Jesus won for us.

How do we fear God and give Him glory?

As those who belong to Christ, do we need to fear the “hour of judgment”?

God uses us, as individuals and as a congregation, to be His messengers to good message the good message. How does the word “evangelical” in our church’s name remind us of this God-given calling?

***Next Sunday’s Readings—All Saints Sunday Revelation 7:9-17; 1 John 3:1-3; Matthew 5:1-12***

**LIVING THE SERMON...** You are a messenger to good message the good message, the Gospel of Jesus Christ! Who has God placed in your life that needs to hear this good and saving message? Pray for the Holy Spirit’s help, strength, and courage to be a faithful messenger of this good message.

**PRAYERS FOR THE CHURCH...** Give thanks to God for the good message, the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Pray that as individuals and as a congregation we would live up to our name: evangelical, that all we proclaim and do would be centered on Christ and the saving Gospel.

**MEMORY VERSE FOR THE WEEK...** *See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are.* 1 John 3:1

### ***About Today’s Service***

The Divine Service for this Reformation Sunday includes the Confession of Sins from the *Small Catechism*. This confession is typically spoken by a person seeking individual absolution from the pastor (see page 291 in the hymnal). The Medieval church distinguished between mortal and venial sins, and falsely taught that mortal sins could only be forgiven by confessing them to a priest. We maintain the Biblical and historical practice of confessing sins to a pastor, especially the sins that trouble you, so that you can receive the confidence that the sins that burden you are truly forgiven and the pastor can provide godly counsel based on Scripture.

The Gloria in Excelsis hymn *All Glory Be to God on High* (947) was written by Nicolaus Decius, a contemporary of Martin Luther. Pastor Decius was a gifted preacher and musician. He translated Latin liturgical texts into German and wrote his own tunes for these texts so people could worship in their native tongue. In addition to *All Glory Be to God on High*, Pastor Decius wrote the German text and composed the tune for the *Agnus Dei: Lamb of God, Pure and Holy* (434). Pastor Decius is often counted among the martyrs of the Reformation as he died by poisoning, most likely by his Roman Catholic enemies.
