The AdventS of Our King

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel
Savior of the Nations, Come
Once He Came in Blessing
Lo! He Comes with Clouds Descending
Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus
The King Shall Come When Morning Dawns
Hark the Glad Sound! The Savior Comes
Come, Thou Precious Ransom, Come
Jesus Came, the Heavens Adoring

The word "advent" means "coming". It's amazing how many of our Advent hymns include the

word "come" in their titles. However, not all these hymns center on the same coming of Christ our Savior. During the season of Advent, we typically focus on Christ's first coming at His incarnation, when He takes on our human flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary, and His birth in Bethlehem. However, the season of Advent extols all the Advents of our Lord—His first advent at His birth more than 2,000 years ago, His coming to us through His Word and His body and blood in the Lord's Supper, and His final advent when He comes in glory on the Last Day.



Although our Advent hymns confess Christ's coming, they don't all sing of the same advent of Christ. Many hymns focus on one of these three comings, while others tell of two or even all three advents of Christ. For our midweek services, through Word and song, we will prepare for the celebration of our Savior's birth as we gather around the theme *The Advents* of *Our King*.

Wednesday, December 3 at 6:45 PM—He Came Wednesday, December 10 at 6:45 PM—He Comes Wednesday, December 17 at 6:45 PM—He Will Come

Advent and the Twelve Days of the Christmas season give us many opportunities to <u>come</u> to God's house for worship and fellowship. This sacred season provides us with the ability to invite others to "<u>Come</u> and see" (John 1:46). Consider those you can invite to these services and events that celebrate Christ's coming among us:

I pray God's richest blessings upon you as we enter the new church year and prepare for our Savior's coming among us. It is a joy to serve as your pastor as we continue to be built up and firmly founded the Solid Rock of Jesus Christ and His Word and extend the love of Christ through our faithful Christian witness, service, and care.

In Christ's Love to Extend Christ's Love,



Come, Thou long-expected Jesus,
Born to set Thy people free;
From our fears and sins release us;
Let us find our rest in Thee.
Israel's strength and consolation,
Hope of all the earth Thou art,
Dear desire of every nation,
Joy of every longing heart.

LSB 338, <u>Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus</u>, is from the pen of the prolific hymn writer, Charles Wesley. This text serves as an introduction to the season of Advent, as we await the coming of God's only Son, our Savior. One characteristic of Wesley's writing is the use of the word, "dear." Additionally, his texts display reverence and balance between "Abba" and "awe"—God as our most loving Father, and God as the Almighty, all-powerful creator of the universe. The tune, JEFFERSON, is found in the early American hymnal, Walker's Southern Harmony, and paints the text in a restrained, yet most convincing manner. It is also both easily sung and remembered.

The phrase, "Let us find our rest in Thee" is particularly appropriate for the Advent and Christmas seasons. We are busy with all of the preparations for the rapidly approaching holidays, both at church and at home. It's a joyous time of year—but also a time that becomes all-consuming of our time and energy. Our focus needs to be on the gift of salvation through Jesus Christ, the Son of God, our Savior! The newborn baby in the manger that laid the foundations of the world, that will suffer and die as an atonement for all our sins, and rise from the dead that we might live eternally. We can indeed rest in the knowledge that we are saved by the greatest gift of all, Jesus Christ. We join with the angels in singing, "Glory to God in the highest, and on the earth, peace, and good will towards men."

The Lutheran pastor and hymn writer, Paul Gerhardt, beautifully states the joy of Christmas in the opening stanza of LSB 372:

O Jesus Christ,

Thy manger is

My paradise at which my soul reclineth.

For there, O Lord,

Doth lie the Word

Made flesh for us; herein Thy grace forth shineth.

God's blessings to you as we sing, rejoice, and find our rest in Christ during Advent and Christmas!



Christian Education

Biblical Translations and Interpretations

The Bible readings this month will take us to the end of the New Testament. It is amazing to see how small specific goals of daily Bible readings and the intentional practice of spending time in God's Word will strengthen the foundation of our faith. I want to challenge you to continue with this practice by reading through the Old Testament, beginning in January.

As we make plans to dig deeper into God's Word, we have the opportunity to be strategic in the version of Scripture we read. It is important to ensure that the version of the Bible that you read is a true translation of God's Word. There are so many versions available. Below you will find an example of how different versions of John 3:16-18 vary and how they impact what you learn from the text.

The original languages of the Bible were written in Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek. Thanks to men like Martin Luther, they translated the original text into the different languages of God's people. This gives people the opportunity to directly read and learn from the Bible. The work of translating the Bible is still being done today, as many people still do not have God's Word written in their own language.

It is critical to ensure that the version of the Bible you are reading is an accurate translation of the original text. The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod has selected the English Standard Version (ESV) of the Bible to use in our instructional and worship materials. Please exercise caution when using paraphrased versions of the Bible. While they are considered easier to read, their interpretation can lead the reader to an incorrect understanding of God's Word.

We see an example of this when we compare the ESV to a paraphrased version of Scripture. Please note the bold and underlined words in the examples below. There is a big difference between words that clearly state Jesus' saving work (ESV) and merely helping people in a sinful world (paraphrased). Jesus **SAVED** us from our sins. To write that Jesus only **HELP**s the world indicates that the burden of salvation relies on our own actions. The bold and italicized phrase in the paraphrased version of the Bible also reinforces a salvation by individual works.

Words matter. God's Word saves. When making a selection on the translation of the Bible that you use, Martin Luther encourages individuals to pick a translation and stick with it. We also have the promise of the Holy Spirit to give us an understanding of what we read. If you have additional questions about Bible translation and different versions of Scripture, please reach out to one of the pastors.

Greek: John 3:16-18

Thus for loved God the world that the Son the only begotten He gave so that everyone believing in Him not should perish but should have life eternal. Not for sent God His Son into the world that He might judge the world but that might be **saved** the world through Him. The believing on Him not is judged the but not believing already has been judged because not he has believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.

English Standard Version

For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be **saved** through Him. Whoever believes in Him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.

The Message (paraphrased)

This is how much God loved the world: He gave His Son, His one and only Son. And this is why: so that no one need be destroyed; by believing in Him, anyone can have a whole and lasting life. God didn't go to all the trouble of sending His Son merely to point an accusing finger, telling the world how bad it was. He came to help, to put the world right again. Anyone who trusts in Him is acquitted; anyone who refuses to trust Him has long since been under the death sentence without knowing it. And why? Because of that person's failure to believe in the oneof-a-kind Son of God when introduced to Him.

News and Notes

The Blessings Keep Coming!

Our Lord is the God from whom all blessings flow, and we are so thankful for His continued grace and blessing! We were blessed with a beautiful fall day for our Groundbreaking service and celebration. Thanks to all who served in our choirs, provided food, and led our youth events.

We have officially entered the construction phase of the project. Sitework will be starting soon! Work will continue in the coming weeks as weather permits.

We are so thankful for your generous support of Extending Christ's Love. Please consider bringing baked goods for Baking for the Building on November 16th and/or taking baked goods home with you for a freewill donation. We also thank everyone who has donated items for the Silent Auction. Bidding begins on Sunday, November 16th and concludes at the Annual Meeting on November 30th.

Another significant development in the past weeks is that the anonymous donor of the \$1 million estate pledge has modified their pledge to a four-year of \$250,000 per year for four years. The first installment of this pledge was received in October. By the donor choosing to fulfill their pledge now instead of later, we will save thousands of dollars in interest.

You also can help us lower our financing charges by accelerating fulfillment of your pledge, increasing your pledge, or making a pledge to Extending Christ's Love if you have not already done so. The more that is contributed in the coming months results in the less we need to finance through Lutheran Church Extension Fund.

The Finance Committee revised the Budget Blueprint since the construction cost is nearly \$300,000 under budget, the change in the \$1 million estate pledge, and an increase in the endowment pledge. The current Budget Blueprint is estimating that our loan at the end of Extending Christ's Love when Extending Christ's Love campaign ends in December 2029 will be \$1,230,000. By comparison, the LCEF loan amount at the end of the capital campaign for the church in 2011 was \$1,200,000. If we continue in our generous support of Extending Christ's Love, we will be in a similar financial position as we were with the construction of the church. To God be the glory!

We are nearing our fundraising goal for the playground project with less than \$17,000 needed to fully fund this project. All gifts will be matched dollar-for-dollar.

Coming soon—Catalog of Needed Items: In the coming months, we will release a Catalog of Items needed for the Christian Education Center and the remodeled office space in the existing church. Members, school families, and nonmembers can sponsor furnishings, appliances, and other items included in the Catalog. Items can be sponsored in memory of or honor of a loved one or in thanksgiving. Donors will be listed in the Dedication Bulletin for the Christian Education Center.


