### Grace Upon Grace

*And from Christ's fullness, we have all received, grace upon grace.*

John 1:16

Grace. What is grace? What does grace do? We talk a lot about grace because the Scriptures talk a lot about grace. We talk a lot about grace because the Bible repeatedly describes the one true God as gracious and merciful. So, exactly what do the Scriptures teach us about grace?

- **Jesus Christ is the source of grace.** From the fullness of Christ, we have received grace. God's grace is clearly revealed in the sacrificial love of Jesus, who became flesh and made His dwelling among us, took on all our sin, and gave His life and shed His blood on the cross to atone and to save.
- **Grace is always a free gift.** Grace comes with no strings attached—no *ifs, ands, or buts*. Grace is God's unconditional love and favor toward us through Christ, and God's grace is for all, even those we might consider unworthy of grace.
- **God's grace is abundant.** Grace upon grace. Grace and even more grace to us sinners who don't deserve any of God's favor. Through Christ, we receive the gifts of grace in abundance: pardon, purity, righteousness, eternal life, joy, hope, wisdom, the power for service, and countless more gifts!
- **God's grace is continuous.** We rightly call God's Word and the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper the *means of grace*, the means by which God personally delivers His grace and gifts of grace to us. As we avail ourselves to these means of grace, we continue to receive the gifts of grace that we need for our earthly pilgrimage.
- **God's grace is powerful and transformative.** The Holy Spirit works through the means of grace to empower us to live and grow in grace as God's baptized children: to live holy lives of good works, faithful confession of the truth and witnessing to others, and strength and endurance while bearing our crosses.

For all our Lenten services through Easter, both Sundays and midweek, we will be focusing on God's abundant, continuous, powerful, and transformative grace freely given to us in Christ. At every service we will examine how God's grace was powerfully given to people in the Scriptures, making applications to God's grace in our lives. I pray that you will attend all these services as we deepen our understanding and appreciation of God's amazing and abundant grace!

# Musical Notes

*"Yes, Father, yes, most willingly  
I'll bear what You command Me.  
My will conforms to Your decree,  
I'll do what You have asked Me."*

The words of Christ as paraphrased by Pastor Paul Gerhardt (1607-76) are found in the third stanza of LSB 438, A Lamb Goes Uncomplaining Forth. The road to the cross is approaching the bitter end—Jesus not only knows but willingly accepts the pain, suffering, and death that awaits. His death is our redemption from sin and death, for through Christ's death we have forgiveness of sins and life eternal in heaven.

*O wondrous Love, what have You done!*

*The Father offers up His Son,  
Desiring our salvation.*

*O Love, how strong You are to save!*

We cannot comprehend a love that is as strong as God's love for sinners. We sin in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and left undone, knowingly, willingly, and repeatedly—and yet we are forgiven through Christ's death on the cross. Jesus died that we might live eternally, that through His resurrection we too might live again as His redeemed people.

*You lay the One into the grave*

*Who built the earth's foundation.*

Please take a moment and read the final two lines of the third stanza of this hymn several times. Let the imagery of Pastor Gerhardt's words really sink in and cause us to pause and reflect on the Creator of all being crucified for us. Christ died for us, Christ died because of our sins, and we rejoice that we are forgiven by God's grace! Let us extend Christ's love as we travel through Lent and await the joy of His resurrection at Easter!

## Reaching out with Christ's love to serve and grow through early childhood education

### Lessons in Learning

The ability to read and write is a skill that must be intentionally and strategically taught. Amazingly enough, this process begins with listening. The best way to lay the groundwork for reading readiness is by reading to children at least 30 minutes a day. As children listen to stories being read, they are able to process the way words sound and expand their vocabulary. Depending on the book, stories teach valuable lessons.

One of the most renowned authors in early literacy happens to be Dr. Suess. Believed to have been born into a Lutheran family, schools across the nation celebrate this one-of-a-kind storyteller during the first week of March, which commemorates his birthday. Dr. Seuss' stories build reading readiness with his use of rhyming, nonsense words, and life lessons.

Children need to know how to break apart the different sounds in words and also to put the sounds together to make up words. Rhyming helps children to discover audible patterns in word sounds. By changing beginning sounds and keeping the end sounds, children can learn to construct word families and start to isolate individual sounds in words.

Similar to rhyming, nonsense words help to frame words that are similar and discover how applying different letter sounds can change words and meanings. Nonsense words help children to identify how words are used in language. They help with identifying real and pretend words by listening to the context and application. Their silliness encourages verbal play with letter sounds and how those sounds come together to make words.

I have always appreciated the opportunities some stories provide to teach a moral lesson. Dr. Suess has a number of stories that invite the reader (or listener) to think beyond the story and challenge them to make the world a better place. The right book can teach young children life skills and social imperatives.

The Bible also promotes early literacy skills, and it generates faith development. Through the words of the Bible, we learn about families of faith and our Heavenly Father. The pages of the Bible are filled with words of truth which teach us context and application. The Bible also tells us of God's perfect Son, Jesus, who saved us from our sins and helps us every day. Happy reading!




## LWML News


