



Epistle ReadingRomans 3:19-28

[Paul writes:] Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. For by works of the law no human being will be justified in His sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in His divine forbearance He had passed over former sins. It was to show His righteousness at the present time, so that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

Next Sunday's Readings—All Saints Sunday Revelation 7:9-17; 1 John 3:1-3; Matthew 5:1-12

LIVING THE SERMON... Amid many trials and persecution for the faith, Martin Luther received much strength and comfort from Psalm 46, so much so that his hymn *A Mighty Fortress Is Our God* is based on this psalm. Pray this hymn devotionally, reflecting on the powerful text. Pray for strength in trial and temptation and rejoice that even if "devils all the world should fill all eager to devour", your God is your mighty fortress, and you are a citizen of His eternal kingdom.

PRAYERS FOR THE CHURCH... Pray for God's grace and blessing as we begin construction of the Christian Education Center. Pray that the Center would always live up to its name—truly a center of Christian education and worship, where many will be blessed through the preaching and teaching of God's holy word.

MEMORY VERSE FOR THE WEEK... Our Christian Education Center

The Christian Education Center is the final phase of our Thirty-Year Master Plan. Responding to continued growth, the congregation adopted a Three Phase Thirty Year Master Plan in 2005. The first phase was completed in April 2009 with the Dedication of our church. The second phase, the expansion of the cemetery, was accomplished in 2015 with the acquisition of property south of the existing cemetery on County Road 300 East.

In conjunction with our 175th anniversary in 2023, we embarked on a two year Friends of Clifty Church campaign. This included the erection of the bell tower by the church so that the bell could call us again to worship. The exterior of the chapel was restored to its original design, along with the installation of new windows, exterior lighting, and signage detailing the history of our congregation. A new retaining wall was also constructed replacing the nearly century-old wall.

With the chapel restored and the bell tower dedicated, the Planning Committee turned their attention to the Christian Education Center. Conceptual designs were presented. In February 2024, the congregation approved the formation of the Building and Finance Committees and to begin a Capital Campaign, Extending Christ's Love, to raise funds for this endeavor. On October 5, 2025, the congregation authorized the beginning of construction of the Christian Education Center.

The Christian Education Center will serve as a hub of mission and ministry for our early childhood ministry, Latino outreach, youth ministry, Sunday School, Bible classes, and fellowship events. The 19,000 square foot facility will include:

- The Great Hall is a large multipurpose room. The chapel area will serve as the location for our Spanish worship services as well as religion and music instruction in our early childhood ministry. On Sundays, the Great Hall will provide additional seating for fellowship and a space for English and Spanish Bible study. The Great Hall will serve as the lunch area during school days, as well as the location for Minds in Motion and for indoor play when the weather is inclement. The Great Hall will provide additional space and a kitchen for church fellowship and youth events.
- The lower level of the Christian Education Center includes four classrooms for our early childhood ministry. The upper level is designed that two additional classrooms can be added, if growth necessitates, allowing us to double the number of children we can serve through this outreach.
- The upper level includes Sunday School classrooms, confirmation instruction room, and a youth room. These classrooms are more than double the size of the rooms we are currently utilizing for Sunday School.
- The current Sunday School area in the existing church will be repurposed for church offices.
- Additional parking will be constructed along the drive behind the church.
- A secure playground and outside gathering area will be located on the backside of the Christian Education Center.

Sitework will begin soon with the goal that the dedication of the Christian Education Center would occur in the first half of 2027. The early childhood ministry will begin utilizing the center with the 2027-2028 school year.

The budget for the Christian Education Center is \$7.8 million. Thanks to the generosity of God's people, pledges for the Extending Christ's campaign are \$4,324,679. Additional income from endowments, grants, fundraising, wish list items, and special projects are estimated to exceed \$2.1 million. We have partnered with the Lutheran Church Extension Fund for financing.

We are grateful for your prayers and financial support for this endeavor. Our heartfelt thanks is extended to the Planning Committee, Building Committee, and Finance Committee for their past, present, and future dedication of time and talent. Above all, we give glory and thanks to God and pray for His blessing and guidance as we begin construction and that the Christian Education Center will be a place where His Word is proclaimed and taught for many generations.
