Extending Christ's Love through Youth Ministry

Dear Friends in Christ,

with you in the coming weeks!

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! It has been a joy to journey with you through the "wilderness" during the forty days of Lent. Now we embark on the great fifty days of the Easter season, culminating on Ascension Sunday, June 1st. Our Lord's resurrection is this most significant day in human history. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins (1 Corinthians 15:17). But Christ has been raised from the dead. His resurrection is celebrated not on a single day, but for an entire fifty-day season. His resurrection is so significant that it's not only celebrated once a year, but once a week, every Sunday the day of resurrection, as we come into the presence of the risen Christ so that He can bless us with His life and salvation through His Word and the feast of Easter victory. I look forward to celebrating Easter

Lent and the upcoming Easter season have given our youth multiple opportunities to grow and learn and enjoy fun and fellowship. On March 7-8, 46 youth attended the lock-in. On April 6th, over 50 youth, young adults, and chaperones enjoyed an afternoon of fun and fellowship at Back Nine Golf. Joy abounded at our Palm Sunday KfC Easter Egg Hunt.

As I write this on Monday of Holy Week, we are looking forward to Good Friday when our youth will gather in God's house on this important day. KfC youth and their parents will participate in Together as Family following our morning service. Our older youth groups will remain into the afternoon to prepare for the Easter breakfast and to watch *Passion of the Christ*. Our youth families will serve Easter breakfast. The Sunday after Easter, April 27th, we will have the opportunity to celebrate with our eleven confirmands and their families as they offer their Confession of Faith presentations during Sunday School, and are confirmed and receive their first Communion. On May 18th, we will recognize our high school and college graduates and pray for God's blessings on the next chapter in their lives.

In the fall of 2021, we expanded our youth ministry to include KfC (Kids for Christ), a youth group for those children fifth grade and younger. In addition, we enhanced our youth ministry through the addition of youth counselors to help plan and organize events and encourage youth to attend. We have been blessed to Extend Christ's Love through our youth ministry, both to our youth and their friends. In 2024, we served over 175 youth through our three youth groups!

In May, our youth ministry will be enhanced as Jennifer Probst transitions into the role of Director of Christian Education (DCE). At the end of the school year, Jen will step away from her preschool teaching responsibilities. She will continue to serve as director of our early childhood ministry and begin leading our Christian education and youth ministries. Jen has years of DCE experience and our Christian education and youth ministries will thrive under her leadership.

When the accreditation team evaluated our school last month, one of their eleven school improvement action items was that the school director needed more time to accomplish administrative responsibilities. After reviewing our plans to have Jen serve in this new role, the accreditation team acknowledged that this transition would fulfill this required action.

I want to thank our youth counselors, youth board, and Christian education board, both past and present, as well as many parent volunteers, for their faithful and sacrificial service. I am so thankful that our youth counselors will continue to serve. I know they will be a tremendous blessing to Jen as they have been to me.

Going forward, I plan to remain involved in our three youth groups, serving and supporting DCE Probst and our youth counselors. In addition, I plan to focus my attention on strengthening our ministry to post-high school young adults.

DCE Probst, our youth counselors, and I are always open to ideas and suggestions on how we can better serve our children, youth, and young adults. Don't hesitate to reach out to us!

Please pray for our confirmands and graduates, the children and youth of our congregation, and our youth leaders, as we endeavor to extend Christ's love to the pext generation.

Extending Christ's Love Update

Your generosity is amazing! The 64-month Fulfillment Phase of our Extending Christ's Love campaign began September 1, 2024. By March 31st, in seven short months, total income has surpassed \$1 million! During this time, we have received additional pledges and gifts, as well as church members increasing their pledges or paying ahead on their pledges. The more that we are able to contribute now the less we will need to finance later on. We are so thankful for your generous support!

The Rummage Sale is fast approaching! This fundraiser can significantly impact income for Extending Christ's Love, but we need everyone's participation. Here's how you can help:

Accreditation Team Identifies Facility and Playground Insufficiencies: The Visitation Team from National Lutheran Schools Accreditation were impressed with many aspects of our early childhood ministry. They commended the congregation's support for the school, our dedicated staff, and high-quality, age-appropriate curriculum. After their visit, our school was awarded a score of 97.55%. A school needs to achieve 80% or higher to maintain accreditation. The Visitation Team identified 11 required action items that must be rectified in the next five years, most of which relate to our facility and playground safety. Thankfully, all the facility and playground action items are already addressed in the design of our Christian Education Center. Thanks to all who served on an accreditation team and to our faithful and dedicated early childhood ministry staff for your faithful, Christ-like service!

Wonderful Reminders of Our Need for More Space for Mission and Ministry: The many events and activities of Holy Week and Easter are a great reminder of our need for additional ministry space. On Palm Sunday, we raised our hosannas of praise as the children carried in palm branches. During Sunday School, the fellowship room was full as our eleven confirmands offered their Confession of Faith. After worship, the joy and excitement of the children was contagious at the Easter egg hunt.

On Good Friday, our fellowship room was overflowing with children and families learning and growing together during our Together as Family time.

On Easter Sunday, our fellowship room was again filled to capacity as we fellowship together as a church family enjoying Easter breakfast. Because of the Easter breakfast, the chapel area for our Spanish service was moved to the Conference Room, a tight fit for worship as attendance at our Spanish services continues to increase.

Our Christian Education Center will enable us to extend the Gospel message of Christ crucified and risen to even more people! The Great Hall in the Christian Education Center will be a hub of mission and ministry. Larger than our current fellowship room, it will offer ample seating for the Easter breakfast and other large congregational events.
