It always amazes me how much our early childhood ministry children learn about Jesus and grow in the faith during the time they are with us at our school.

Obviously, since our mission is to extend Christ's Love, then we must be all about Christian Education. It's through the Word that faith is given and strengthened. Through the Word, the gifts and blessings that Jesus won on the cross are personally delivered to every individual, young or old. I'm so thankful that we have opportunity to teach these little children in our early childhood

Christ's love is extended through our many Christian education ministries. Your ongoing support for our Extending Christ's Love campaign will provide the space and place for all our Christian Education ministries to thrive and grow for many years to come in the *Christian Education Center*. It's not a fancy name, but it's so appropriate! That's the purpose of this expansion: young and old will be taught God's Word and their faith fortified and strengthened through this teaching.

In Psalm 102:18 the psalmist writes: Let this be recorded for a generation to come, so that a people yet to created may praise the Lord. Make the commitment to remain in God's Word through daily devotions, Bible study, and Sunday School. 


