Christmas in the Trenches

His childhood home and church were reduced to rubble in the Thirty Years War
His parents both died before he was 15 years old
He outlived his wife and four of his five children
He buried scores of church members during the plague
He was removed from his pastorate in Berlin for refusing to compromise God's Word
He composed 17 hymns which are included in our hymnal

The memorial plaque above his grave reads: "A theologian sifted in Satan's sieve"

Pastor Paul Gerhardt (1607-1676) endured war and plague, death and sorrow, unemployment and poverty during his life. From these intense trials, Gerhardt composed rich hymn texts that we continue to sing to this day. One of my favorite Gerhardt hymn stanzas is from his Advent hymn O Lord, How Shall I Meet You:

Love caused Your incarnation; Love brought You down to me.
Your thirst for my salvation Procured my liberty.
Oh, love beyond all telling, That led You to embrace
In love, all love excelling, Our lost and fallen race. (Hymn 334:4)

Pastor Gerhardt composed three Christmas hymns from the trenches of suffering and sorrow that are included in our hymnal. For our Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services, we will focus on each of these three hymns, unpacking their Biblical truths while remembering the man who wrote these hymns amid his countless struggles and trials.

Although Christmas is a season of life and joy, the reality is that every Christmas is celebrated in the trenches of our struggles and sorrows, just like it was for Pastor Gerhardt. There may be empty chairs at your Christmas celebration this year as death has separated you from those you love. There may be health struggles, financial difficulties, family strife, and uncertainty about the future. On this side of glory, Christmas Day and every day is a day lived in the trenches, on the front line of the never-ending battle against the devil, the world, and our own sinful flesh.

But God is faithful! He gave us His greatest gift in His Son born of Mary, who willingly left the glories of heaven and entered this world, choosing to dwell among us in the trenches, experiencing suffering and sorrow just like us, choosing to dwell in the trenches to fight for us and to conquer sin, Satan, death, and the grave. As a result of the baby born in Bethlehem, like Pastor Gerhardt, there is a song of joy and praise in our hearts. This child is our Savior, our Lord, our Immanuel—our God with us—in every trial and sorrow.

I look forward to celebrating Christ's birth with you. Please consider those you can invite to join you for worship and the many special events this sacred season. Our Christmas Eve services will each be proceeded by 20 minutes of Christmas carol singing and conclude with candlelight and the singing of *Silent Night*.

Happy New Year! The final stanza of the Christmas hymn, <u>Let Us All with Gladsome Voice</u>, LSB 390, closes the Christmas season with a prayer for the new year. We pray that 2026 is a good year for all in our families and congregation, and also offer thanks for the blessings we received throughout the past year.

Let's begin the new year by looking at the importance of music within the flow of the liturgy. As we have discussed in the past, everything in the liturgy/Divine Service supports the spoken Word of God. Since all actions exist to serve the Word, none of the actions glorify themselves but rather seek to give back the gifts first given from our Lord. Scriptures, the sermon, hymns, and the sung and spoken parts of the liturgy all join in unified thought and action to create a seamless flow throughout the service. Within this flow exist the two parts of the Divine Service—Service of the Word and Service of the Sacrament. The Service of the Word moves through the Offertory and Prayers and flows into the Service of the Sacrament.

The Hymn of the Day serves as the main hymn and is most closely tied to the sermon text. The hymn sung during the Offertory, or the sung liturgical setting, ties into the Scriptures/sermon text and often summarizes and/or reinforces the theme of the day. Additional hymns are sung at the opening and close of service, as well as during The Lord's Supper. Each of the settings of the Divine Service found in Lutheran Service Book contains specific, congregationally sung responses for the Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, Agnus Dei, and Nunc Dimittus. The Alleluia, or Alleluia and verse, may be sung prior to the Gospel; however, the choir may sing an appropriate verse of the day in its' place. Other opportunities for the choir are in alternation during a congregational hymn, in place of a congregational Offertory, or during Distribution. All sung hymns and liturgical responses relate to the theme of the day and "cradle" God's Word as found in the Scriptures and sermon.

Each piece was designed with purpose and echoes the individuality of the child. From time to time, their gifts of art make it into my hands without their attempt to draw their name on their creation.

The artistic renditions are special on their own. The time and strategy for detail are reflected in the final product. I love to display this work on my door or on the wall by my office so that I am reminded of the child's thoughtfulness. This also gives others the opportunity to view it. Simply looking at the artwork satisfies curiosity. Referencing the creator's name adds a point of reference, meaning, and appreciation.

Our pastors and teachers take the time to teach our students the value of God's name. In the Apostles' Creed, God is identified as the Master Creator. He has made us and all things. By learning the 10 Commandments, children learn that God's name is holy. It is set apart to be referenced with respect and love. As we learn the Lord's Prayer, our students discover that they can call on God as their Father. God urges us to use His name in prayer, praise, and when we need His help.

The Apostle Paul in his letter to the Ephesians tells us this, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. Chronology

People are creatures of time. Genesis tells us the origin of time. We can read the amazing account of how God created all things within a 24-hour day and a 7-day week. The sun, moon, and stars also give us a reference for the passing of the seasons.

While the Bible starts with the beginning of time and finishes with eternity, the layout of the books between Genesis and Revelation are not completely chronological. Its layout divides the time before Christ and the time after Jesus was born. The books of the Bible also group books of history, poetry, letters, and prophecy. There are so many ways to line up the incredible information found in Scripture and receive the bountiful gifts God gives through His Word.

The Scriptural reading program listed below follows an analytical and historical understanding of the timing of the accounts found in God's Word. It attempts to establish an order of the Biblical text from the creation of the heavens and the earth to the new Heaven and new Earth. Interestingly, Biblical scholarship places Job's lifetime after Noah and before Abraham. No matter the order, we can be confident that our faith grows each time we read from the Bible. I pray God's richest blessings as you continue or make a beginning of reading God's Word every day and strengthening your foundation in Christ!
