Dear Church Family,

They have witnessed our congregation's growth in mission, ministry, and size throughout their lives. Dalton and Libby bring a different perspective. Married in February, they know the Christian Education Center will be a blessing to them and their future children, and so they desire to support this endeavor.

One of the first tasks was to choose the campaign theme to guide our focus for the next five years. We were blessed to have many themes submitted. ## Early Childhood Ministry

The Creator of the universe is a God of order. Throughout Scripture, we read stories of the establishment of structures to help us govern our world and best serve God's people. Moses established chiefs to communicate the law to varying groups of

Governance is an important facet of National Lutheran School Accreditation. Policies and procedures are put into place to maintain order and support the needs of the school. As one of the mission arms of the church body, the school needs an efficient governing structure to offer protection and accountability. A clear definition and flow of this administrative branch provides steps to address concerns and empower staff vocations.

Analysis of the church governing authority includes an assessment of the Early Childhood Director. The Accreditation team is tasked with identifying how the Early Childhood Director is qualified, exercises leadership skills, and performs the tasks expected of the position. Our leaders are entrusted with the great responsibility of stewarding God's creation.

Our congregational teams have been sent out to gather the evidence needed for our accreditation self-study. In their discoveries, we will be able to identify the things St. Paul does well and those things we need to improve upon. I continue to be excited about their accomplishments and sharing them with you. Please let me know if you have further questions.

### Rhythm of the Liturgy

I always hear a snicker when the hymn, "Stand up, Stand up for Jesus" is played and the congregation remains seated while singing it. Our Lutheran liturgy is filled with all kinds of significant movements. Similar to the shapes and colors in the church, the design of our actions is to point us to Jesus.

There are times in the worship service when we are asked to STAND. Examples include the Gospel readings which record the ministry of Jesus and our unified confession of faith. We stand to show respect to our Lord and our unity as His body of believers.

Other parts of the worship service have us SITTING. This body posture reflects a receiving of God's gifts and a humility for the mercy that God extends to us.

The pastor also has special movements when he officiates the service. There are times when he is facing the altar. This action conveys his position before God as a servant and on behalf of God's people. Other times, the pastor is facing the congregation. During these times, he is acting as God's called shepherd to serve God's people. It is good to be an active part of worship.
